

One of India's most successful photojournalists, Rajan is Director at BVSP. Critically acclaimed for his pictures, he has led large photo-teams through his career. His forte is conceptualising, ideating, and planning special shoots of leading stars and newsmakers. Working with 14 of the country's leading editors, he has managed photo-desks, acquired the best pictures, and created archival packages.

Confluence of Dreams, a solo show on the Kumbh Mela, Kashmir After Kargil, a group show, and Camera Never Lies, a solo show on celebrity candids inaugurated by Mr. Amitabh Bachchan are platforms on which Rajan's work has been exhibited.

"Our vision is to contribute to the world of photography via photo artists who are second to none, towards which we have structured our institution", he says. 














Kabeer Patil






Vaishnav & Apeksha, Class of 2014/2015.














Manas & Parth, Class of 2015.





Sourabh Gate,


Class of 2016.





Yash Yeri, Class of 2016.
